Spring 2013 MAR Field Meet

The Spring 2013 MAR Field Meet was held at Woodward Cave Campground the weekend of May 3-5. The event was co-hosted by the Commander Cody Caving Club and Philadelphia Grotto. The event kicks off the celebration of 60 years of the Mid-Appalachian Region of the National Speleological Society. 119 cavers from eight different states attended the event. The states of Connecticut, Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Virginia and West Virginia were all represented. The temperatures were a little chilly at night but otherwise it was a beautiful spring weekend.

Friday afternoon registration opened. A few of you may have noticed the new MAR banner hanging at the registration tent. This project was spearheaded by Amos Mincin. The banner will be displayed at the upcoming NSS convention in Shippensburg and can be used for subsequent MAR events for years to come.

Friday night, cavers were treated to a showing of the horror movie, Descent, complete with big screen and audio through the PA system. Plot synopsis - hot chicks go caving, they get trapped in the cave, the cave is inhabited by creatures that hunt them down and kill them all. Other folks gathered around the bonfire that burned next to the pavilion. Barry Duncan's Cavers Connection business was going well. Cave trip signup sheets went out around 10:00 PM. Quiet time came way too early and the campground manager had to ask us to refrain from celebrating so enthusiastically.

Saturday morning, cavers were treated to coffee with fresh donuts from Burkholder's Country Market in Millheim. Yummy! The led cave trips went out as early as 8:30 AM and as late as 10:30 AM. There were led trips to Alexander Caverns, Big Ridge Cave, Blacklog Cave, Hennigh Cave, Kooken Cave, Seawra Cave and Tytoona Cave. Cavers were able to decontaminate their caving gear after the trip at a decon station set up in the campground. Woodward Cave offered reduced admission for MAR attendees and there were two guided trips into the cave that day.

The dinner Saturday evening was catered by none other than the famous Clem's BBQ. Clem's has provided food to many caving events in the area over the years. They arrived right on time and commenced to serving up. Unfortunately during the serving they ran out of food. They made a relatively quick trip in the van to get more food from their kitchen location and were back to serving. This delay was only slightly annoying to those waiting in line. All were fed and

full that night. After dinner some awesome door prizes were awarded to some lucky cavers. Thanks to Cavers Connection, Hodag Video, On Rope 1 and Speleobooks for graciously donating door prizes for the event. A 60th anniversary cake complete with the MAR logo topped off the dinner activities with Pat Minnick blowing out the candles.

Our guest speaker Saturday night was MAR Chairman, Paul Winter. Paul gave cavers a fascinating presentation on recent exploration and digging projects by the Butler Cave Conservation Society in the Burnsville Cove area of Virginia. Many event attendees had no idea of the amazing speleoengineering efforts going on down there and were quite impressed by the presentation. Thanks again to both Paul Winter for presenting and Phil Lucas for the digital content for the presentation. After the presentation the disco balls were fired up and folks danced to the sounds of DJ Bill until quiet time shut us down again. Cavers gathered at the bonfire until the wee hours telling stories and planning their next adventures.

Sunday morning, cavers were treated to a delicious pancake breakfast organized by the Pennsylvania Cave Conservancy (PCC). The PCC meeting was held afterwards. Cavers started packing up to go home. There was a Penn Aqua Cave trip Sunday afternoon for a few of the MAR cavers.

We would like to thank Woodward Cave for use of their facility for the event. Secretary Report: The minutes from the February 2013 meeting were read and accepted as published in the April 2013 MAR Breakdown.

Treasurer Report: Gary Dunmire reported that earned interest was added to the account and a \$400.00 fee was paid for the PCC tax exempt status.

Web Page: The PCC web page continues to be up and running. The county stewards have been posted as well as the latest PCC meeting minutes. The Restricted Cave Listing has been updated with the PA Longest and Deepest Cave listings from the PA Cave Database provided by Tony Canike. Any comments or corrections should be directed to Dave Fricke and Tony Canike.

PCC Breakfast: Despite some temporary equipment malfunctions, the PCC breakfast was a success with 65 people served and \$305.00 donated to the PCC. The pancake grill will require some maintenance prior to the PCC breakfast during the upcoming Fall MAR Field Meet. Pat Minnick will transport the equipment and supplies to Gary Dunmire's home to be stored until the fall. A special thank you goes out to Philadelphia Grotto and Commander Cody Caving Club for donating extra food for the breakfast.

PCC Brochure: Anyone interested in obtaining brochures should contact George Bange.

Mail: Dean Snyder stated there was nothing new to report.

Christmas Cards: Karen Bange continues to manage the yearly distribution of Christmas cards to cave landowners. Contact Karen if you have a landowner you want added to the Christmas card list.

T-shirts: Gary Dunmire continues to have PCC 25th anniversary T-shirts available at \$15 each (approximately \$17.65 with shipping). Dean Synder also has older PCC shirts available for sale at \$5 each.

PA Cave Database: Tony Canike provided information to Dave Fricke which was posted on the PCC web site. Amos Mincin has reviewed the published list and provided corrections to Tony.

OLD BUSINESS:

Project List:

Dragon Cave (Berks County, PA) – Dean Synder stated there is nothing new to report. Relations with the cave owner continue to be good.

Red Church Cave (Schuylkill County, PA) – Dean Synder indicated there is nothing new to report. Dean has the key to the cave gate and is available to lead a few trips per year. Interested individuals must be NSS members.

Merkle Cave (Berks County, PA) – Dean Snyder reported ongoing attempts are in process to contact the cave owner and gain visitor access to the cave.

Cleversburg Cave (Cumberland County, PA) – Pat Minnick reported that Tom Feeney, the lead for ongoing scientific study in Cleversburg cave, will be leading a geology bus tour during the upcoming NSS convention.

Schofer Cave (Berks County, PA) – Dean Snyder acquired new contact information from the Game Commission and is attempting to obtain a face to face meeting to discuss gaining access to the cave.

Corker Hill and Frustration Pit (Franklin County, PA) – Amos Mincin has recently done some surveying of the cave. He reported that more work is required to complete the survey and he hopes to complete the survey prior to the upcoming convention.

Peiper Cave (Cumberland County) – No new issues to report. Joe Schock will be on site to monitor the cave during the upcoming 2013 NSS Convention. Anyone interesting in gaining entry into Peiper Cave should <u>ALWAYS</u> contact the cave owners, Kim and Ed Kehs Sr., for entry permission and to complete the required waivers prior to gaining entry to the cave.

Dreibilbis Cave (Berks County) – Owner relations continue to be good and the cave is available for trips. Mike Mostardi or Bill Schultz can be contacted and will act as a trip leader when needed.

J4 Cave (Centre County) – Gary Dunmire has requested some information from Graymont and is awaiting a response.

PCC Tax Exempt Status: Gary Dunmire has filed the forms to re-establish the PCC's tax exempt status and is awaiting a reply/confirmation.

PCC Grotto membership: Any grotto is welcome to apply to join the PCC. The PCC would like to stress the importance of a grotto representative being present at all meetings in order for the PCC to obtain a quorum and continue to conduct business.

DCNR Karst Maps: Christopher Catherman reported that DCNR quad karst maps are available to be downloaded from the DCNR website free of charge.
